WILLIAM LANE CRAIG is Research Professor at Talbot School of Theology in La Mirada, California. He earned a doctorate in philosophy at the University of Birmingham, England, before taking a doctorate in theology from the Ludwig Maximilians Universität-München, Germany, at which institution he was for two years a fellow of the Alexander von Humboldt-Stiftung, writing on the historicity of the resurrection of Jesus. He spent seven years at the Katholike Universiteit Leuven, Belgium, before taking his post at Talbot in 1994. He has authored or edited over thirty books, including Assessing the New Testament Evidence for the Historicity of the Resurrection of Jesus: Will the Real Jesus Please Stand Up? (with John Dominic Crossan), and Jesus' Resurrection: Fact or Figment? (with Gerd Lüdemann), as well as numerous articles in professional journals such as New Testament Studies, Journal for the Study of the New Testament, Expository Times, and Kerygma und Dogma. He currently lives in Atlanta with his wife, Jan; they have two children, Charity and John.

John Dominic Crossan is Emeritus Professor of Religious Studies at DePaul University in Chicago, Illinois. His most important books are The Historical Jesus: The Life of a Mediterranean Jewish Peasant (1991), The Birth of Christianity (1998), and In Search of Paul: How Jesus' Apostle Opposed Rome's Empire with God's Kingdom, coauthored with archaeologist Jonathan Reed of LaVerne University (2004). His work has been translated into ten foreign languages, including Korean, Chinese, and Japanese, and he has lectured to lay and scholarly audiences across the United States as well as in Ireland and England, Finland, Australia, New Zealand, and South Africa.

Craig A. Evans is Payzant Distinguished Professor of New Testament at Acadia Divinity College in Nova Scotia. He received his Ph.D. from Claremont Graduate University. Professor Evans is author and
