Preface

This book is the fruit of two colloquia of the Académie Internationale des Sciences Religieuses (AISR) on the theological theme of Christology, held under the chairmanship of Professor Stuart George Hall. The first colloquium was held at Wycliffe Hall, Oxford, from 25th to 29th August 2006. Our stay at Oxford was greatly assisted by the capable services of Mrs Lynda Boyce. Fraternal evenings of discussion were made the more agreeable by the drinks offered by our President, Stuart Hall. He was also our guide to the magnificent town of Oxford on a fine summer afternoon, which ended with an unforgettable Evensong in the superb Oxford Cathedral at Christ Church.
